

Five Ways to Care For Your Community



We know many VSP® network doctors give back to their communities or are looking for easy ways to do so. Explore five easy ways to leverage VSP Vision™ Eyes of Hope® to support increased access to vision care for people in need.

1. **See patients with a VSP Eyes of Hope gift certificate.** The easiest way to provide no-cost vision care for people in need is simply to see them in your practice and be reimbursed by VSP Vision Care.

Certificates are distributed by charitable partners, including state optometric associations, Lions Clubs, Prevent Blindness, and school nurses, who qualify the recipients. Coverage includes an eye exam, a Marchon or Altair® frame up to \$150 retail (\$57 wholesale), and single vision or lined multifocal lenses under the VSP Choice Plan®. Children are also covered for polycarbonate lenses and a portion of vision therapy.

2. **Volunteer onboard a VSP Eyes of Hope mobile clinic to support vision care outreach.** You can volunteer on an event scheduled in your community or request one to support your partnership with a charitable organization or school in your community.

Each mobile clinic is fully equipped with an eye exam room plus one portable lane, a fully stocked eyewear dispensary, a finishing lab to make glasses, and the ability to send glasses that can't be made onboard to a VSPOne® lab. Events are scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis when not deployed to a disaster.

3. **Request a donation of optical frames for your outreach or mission trip.** VSP Vision eyewear companies Marchon and Altair Eyewear donate new frames and sunglasses to support eye doctors, schools of optometry, and optometric organizations who are participating in charitable outreach in the U.S. or beyond.

4. **Request a portable exam equipment loan for your outreach.** Equipment is available for loan to eye doctors, optometric associations, and schools of optometry at no cost for their charity outreach or mission trips. Each lane includes all of the equipment needed for doctors to provide comprehensive eye exams to patients.

5. **Care for community members affected by disaster.** VSP members in need of eye care or replacement eyewear can have their benefits immediately reinstated if they're not currently eligible. Other community members can contact a local Red Cross chapter or shelter to request a VSP Eyes of Hope Disaster Relief gift certificate for no-cost vision care, and you'll be reimbursed for the care you provide.
